

## Easter Craft Pack

### Instructions

These fun chick decorations are a great way to get your little ones excited for Easter.

You only need paper, scissors, and glue, so they're perfect if you haven't got a lot of craft materials to hand.

If your children are young and it's a little tricky, try and get them to help with the cutting and sticking.


If they're slightly older, let them have a go at making one on their own.

#### You will need:


- A4/A3 yellow and orange paper (but you can use whatever colour you have available)
- Scissors
- String
- Pritt Stick










1. Print off an 8cm circle to use as a template or, if you don't have a printer, use a standard mug.






2 . Draw around your circle/mug 8 times and cut them out carefully. Use a pencil so that you can rub out the lines once you're finished.





3. Fold your circles in half. Glue the back left side to the right side of the other circle, and continue until you have one circle left.



4 . Fold a long piece of string in half, glue it in the middle, and then glue the first circle to the last.



5 . Cut a triangle of orange paper for the beak and a wing. Stick onto the circles and draw an eye.

Hang your Easter chicks!

### Instructions

Follow these simple step-by-step instructions to make a lovely, personalised Easter chick poster with your little ones.


Get your children to draw around their hands, or to make it a little easier, use paint and press their hands onto the paper.

#### You will need:


- A4/A3 yellow and orange paper (but you can use whatever colour you have available)
- Scissors
- Pritt Stick
- Pens
- Paint (optional)








1. Print the Easter egg template at the back of this pack. Draw around the egg on your coloured paper. Cut out.




2. Draw around your right hand and your left hand, and cut out. Or press your hands into paint and print them onto your paper.




3. Arrange the egg and your hands on your paper. Stick it down. Cut out a diamond shape for the beak, fold in half and stick the bottom half down.



4. If you have googly eyes, then please do use them! If you need to make your own, cut own small circles of white paper. Use a pen to draw the eyes and stick above the beak.



5. To make the legs, use a ruler to cut out rectangles (5cm long and 1.5 cm wide), and glue. For your birds feet, cut out a shape with three points like the one shown in the picture and stick.
